## Alliance trainings, resources and services accelerate land conservation.

Land trusts that deeply engage with Land Trust Alliance services:

-are nearly **2X** more likely to increase conserved lands.<sup>1</sup>

–protected almost 2X the acres over a five-year period as their unengaged peers.<sup>1</sup>

Collectively, land trusts have conserved **65 million acres** nationwide.

## Our alliance of land trusts works to conserve the nation's biodiversity.

Land trusts complete an average of

## **4,000** biodiversity projects per year:<sup>2</sup>

88% of land trusts prioritize projects to address the needs of people and communities:

- Access to nature and recreation
- Clean drinking water

- Local food

An average of **3,500 land trust projects** a year address human needs.<sup>3</sup>

**91%** of land trusts report they meaningfully engage their local communities in developing and implementing projects.

<sup>2</sup> The total biodiversity projects came from a recent survey of a representative sample of land trusts, where respondents reported that between 2014 and 2024, they completed an average of 737 biodiversity projects per year. We extrapolated that out based upon current members and their rate of engagement in biodiversity projects.

<sup>3</sup> The total human well-being projects came from the same survey as noted above, where respondents reported that between 2014 and 2024, they completed an average of 676 human well-being projects per year. We extrapolated that out based upon current members and their rate of engagement in projects that address human well-being.
